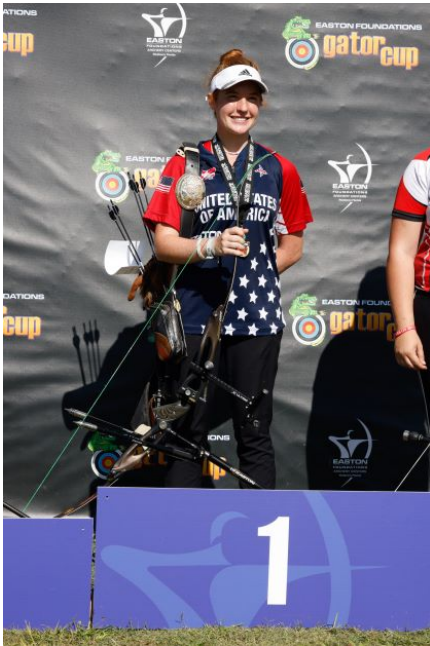

Our First 100/200 Rimfire Benchrest Match

The inaugural 100/200 Yard Rimfire Benchrest Match was held Saturday June 11th. The weather was good, no rain and manageable wind conditions which is critical for shooting rimfire rifles at long distances. There was a positive energy amongst the Competitors about holding a long range rimfire match at the Kenmore Range and everyone had a good time. The Match went smoothly, and the one relay was completed within 90 minutes which was one of the fundamental goals of the match. 9 Competitors were present, however a dozen individuals replied with existing conflicts, which does make for a positive outlook for the long term success of the match.

The 100 yard top score went to TQ who shot a 197 out of 200. The target used was the Cast Bullet target which has a 0.69 inch 10 ring. Keith Wilson and Kevin Kellogg tied for 2nd place with scores of 195. Harvey Waldron and Mark Huber tied for 4th with scores of 194.

The 200 yard target had 1 point separating the top two Competitors, with TQ taking 1st place edging out Keith Wilson who took 2nd place 190 / 189. They were shooting sub 3 inch groups at 200 yards with rimfire rifles and a gusty cross wind. 3rd place went to Harvey Waldron who shot a 185. Once again the maximum 200 yard score was 200 points.

The overall winner for the June Match was TQ with a 387 out of 400. Keith Wilson finished in 2nd place with a 384. 3rd place went to Harvey Waldron with a 379.

The Match also features an optional one shot contest at 200 yards called a "Buck – A – Shot". The contest shoots the 100 yard Cast Bullet target with a 0.69 inch 10 ring. Harvey Waldron was the Inaugural winner of this contest and shot an outstanding 10 with his one shot at 200 yards.

The next 100 /200 Rimfire Benchrest Match will be held on the 2nd Saturday in August (8/13), so mark your calendars now. If you are interest in attending, you will need to contact the Match Director Keith Wilson at knjcwilson@msn.com.

The Cast Bullet targets are available in the target locker if you would like to practice on them at 100 yards. But NO practicing at 200 yards with rimfire rifles is allowed on the Kenmore Range.

Archery report:

Ken Deleone presented.
Ken purchased the new four wheeler.
They also started the process for the 3D shoot. It is on our Facebook and our website.
He would like to purchase another weed eater. Joe said to go ahead.
JOAD program - Emma Kim won a bronze in France.
We discussed potential people who could run the juniors program.

Handgun Report:

Martin Morehouse presented.
Range 3 will be closed for a few more weeks. So, we may look to have some of the Bullseye events in the Club House.

Rifle Report:

Martin Morehouse presented.
We are looking for people who may want to join a small bore team.
The Postal Match is happening soon. It would be good to get a team in the event.
We need to order some magazines for our rifles.

Shotgun Report:

Joe Rinaldi presented.
We got more ammunition.
We will have a 5-stand event. It will be a seven-week event.
We had a successful PITA shoot even though the weather was poor.

Manager's Report:

Robert Haverstock presented.

More ammo has arrived. We are receiving a shipment of clays next week. Price of clays went up again.

Mowers and weed eaters are down. They are being repaired.

They have been looking at the shotgun schedule.

Robert proposed shutting down Mondays to public but open to members (noon to 5pm). We could also do that on Wednesdays (noon to 5pm). If we did this, we would need to run training for members on how to fill and manage machines. We discussed this for a little while. After the conversation, we decided to leave the schedule the way it currently is.

Robert said the new cleaning service is doing well.

Treasurer's Report:

Larry Mallory presented.

April/May dues and initiation fees are down 23% from this time last year. We have also seen a significant drop in shotgun fees. Our renters paid over \$93k while the club only netted \$33k.

Trustees Report:

Scott R. and John S. presented.

We discussed the lighting for Shotgun. We have a couple lights out that we need to replace. We will do that right away.

5-stand and field 4 need new lights. This would take 9 flood lights and they would cost just under \$20,000. Adding field 3 to the quote would cost an additional \$5,000. Since we are heading into summer, there is no reason to do this right now. We will wait until next month to vote on adding the lights.

We have finished installing and have paid for the wall in Range 3. Now we will be installing the baffles. We need to set the first baffles before we can see where we put the next baffles. We are hoping we only have 3 weeks left to finish this phase of the work on Range 3. We need to draw up plans for the next phase of the Range 3 update. Joe asked Martin to send out a request to members asking for help to draw up plans. For example, if there is an architecture student or civil engineer who could help us.

Marketing Report:

Martin Morehouse presented.

Martin mentioned he got a list of members who have visited the club within the last 6 months from John W. Martin will send out a message to these people saying thank you for stopping by. He will also ask John W. for a list of people who have not been to the range within the last 6 months. Martin will send a targeted message to that group of people asking them to come back to the range.

Old Business:

Robert has not yet implemented the "round up" policy. Robert will work with John W. to implement this policy over the next month.

We had a discussion regarding the name of the club. We will be filing our name as Wildlife Committee of Washington. We will start calling our club WCW Kenmore Shooting Sports. We will keep our URL as wcwshootingsports.org. We will use the name WCW Kenmore Shooting Sports on all our literature and website.

New Business:

Jon Schillios is the new Hunting and Fishing Committee chair. He will be heading up the Hunting and Fishing Committee. His plan is to start having quarterly meetings with the Department of Game and Wildlife. He is also thinking about having open office hours to help people who are interested in hunting. Another thought is to work on getting trips organized for members. He is also open to suggestions. Joe was thinking about putting out an email to all members who hunt and fish. Have a meeting with those people to find out their interests. Robb suggested we include information in the newsletter about different hunting seasons and other hunting topics. Martin told Jon to contact him to let him know what he wants in the newsletter and to schedule the committee meetings. Someone asked if members are allowed to shoot a pattern board for their shotgun. Robert said they can do this on members night.

Martin investigated the steel baffles to find out how much they cost including installation. The quotes varied widely. He decided to wait to pursue anything further until we have the new baffles up and we are looking into the new retrieval systems.
