There were nine contestants in this month's 300-yard benchrest match with four contestants in the Sharpshooter Division and five in the Expert Division.

Match 1 Expert Division: Richard Nicol finished first with a match high score of 103. Parker Letson was second with a 102 and Ernie Snyder third with a score of 100. Sharpshooter Division: Pat Farrell finished first with a score of 100 with Ben Brinkley in second at 99 and Rob Noges finishing third with a score of 97.

Match 2 Expert Division: Bryon Zolnikov and Rick Beginski tied for first with a score of 100. Parker Letson, Ernie Snyder, and Richard Nicol tied for third with scores of 99. Sharpshooter Division: Pat Farrel finished first with a score of 98 with Ben Brinkley in second at 97 and Rob Noges placing third at 96.

Match 3 Expert Division: Parker Letson finished first with a score of 99. Ernie Snyder was second with a score of 98 and Richard Nicol placed third with a score of 97. Sharpshooter Division: Ben Brinkley was first with a score of 99 with Pat Farrel in second with a score of 96. Rob Noges placed third with a score of 94.

August NRA Highpower Match Report

The NRA match this month was an all-AR affair. Four shooters came out on a nice morning to shoot variations on the AR-15 rifle, some with scopes, some with iron sights.

Our high score this time was Robert Shuey, firing a 451-0X.

Right behind him was Charles Wesley, scoring 427-4X.

Third place in this squad was George Smith, shooting a 407-2X.

And finally, with almost no equipment besides his rifle, Luke Cantwell scored 236-1X.

If you want to see how this match is done, our next one is scheduled for 12 November. There can be a lot of equipment involved, like spotting scopes, shooting jackets, shooting mats, and more. But like Luke showed, it's possible to just bring what you have and learn the match from the ground up. You can use an AR, but you could also use a Garand, a Springfield, a Krag, an M1 carbine, or even foreign military rifles like a 98 Mauser.

We have been seeing new shooters recently, hope to see more in November!

The August 100 / 200 Yard Rimfire Match was held on Saturday the 12th. The August Match had 13 Competitors with 10 shooting from the Bench and 3 shooting as “fully supported” prone. It was a very good day to shoot as the temperatures where in the mid to upper 60’s. The sky was mostly sunny, but the humidity was a little high (upper 70%) which made it a little sticky especially at the start of the Match. The wind was from the NNE and was a nominal 1 – 2 mph. However, there were sporadic gusts that were 3 – 6 mph that made things a little more challenging. Note: All wind readings are from the Range 1 weather station.

100 Yard Results:

200 Yard Results:

At 200 yards Brian Lapinski set a new 200 yard Record Top Score shooting an exceptional 193 out of 200, which was good for 1st place. This is the second Match in a row that the Record Top Score at 200 yards was set. This is exceptional shooting for 22LR rounds when considering the size of the target at 200 yards: The 10 ring on the target is only 1.5 inches in diameter or 3/4 of an MOA. TQ shot an outstanding 190 for 2nd place. This score also tied him for 4th place on the All Time Record High Scores at 200 yards. Keith Wilson also had a very good day shooting a 188 for 3rd place.

Total Combined Scores:

Brian Lapinski had the top total combined score for the August Match shooting an outstanding 389 out of 400 possible points which was good for 1st place. This score also tied him for 2nd place on the All Time Record High Combined Score. 2nd place went to Keith Wilson who had a very consistent day with an outstanding total score of 386. Leveraging his 100 yard top score, Joe Little took 3rd place with an outstanding score of 383.

“Buck – A – Shot” Winner:

The “Buck – A – Shot” winner in August was Keith Wilson who had a 10 point shot at 200 yards on the Cast Bullet 100 yard target. Keith beat out Joe Little by a whisker as both of them made exceptional shots that looked like clones. Note: the 10 ring used on this target is only 0.69 inches in diameter and the shot was at 200 yards.

The Cast Bullet targets are available in the target locker if you would like to practice on them at 100 yards. NO practicing at 200 yards with rimfire rifles is allowed on the Kenmore Range. The second 100 / 200 Rimfire Benchrest Match of 2023 was held on Saturday June 10th. The June Match had 14 Competitors with 11 shooting from the Bench and 3 shooting as "fully supported" prone. It was a typical cool & wet spring day in the PNW. Temperatures were around 53 degrees with a light rain during the entire Match. The wind was actually very cooperative for once with average wind speeds in the 1 – 2 mph range with occasion sporadic gusts up to 5 mph.

WCW Members Compete in July N50 Benchrest Match in Tacoma

Seven WCW Range members: Mark Huber, Kevin Kellogg, Joe Little, TQ, Don Smith, Harvey Waldron, and Keith Wilson competed in the N50 Benchrest Match held on Sunday August 13th at the Tacoma Rifle and Revolver Club. N50 is a National Organization that offers an opportunity for both Air Rifles and 22LR Rimfire Rifles to compete side by side in 3 Classes: Pro - Slug / Rimfire, Sportsman – Slug / Rimfire, and Pellet.

It was a beautiful day for a Match if you ignore the nasty wind conditions. The temperature started out in the upper 60's and by the end of Relay 2 it was near 80 degrees and the sky was crystal clear. The wind on the other hand was just down right challenging. Relay 1 saw wind speeds ranging anywhere from a light breeze (2 – 3 mph) all the way up to 12 mph with higher gusts. The challenge was reading the wind and finding the right time to shoot. Relay 2 actually saw a reduction in the top wind speeds into the 7 – 9 mph range, but with higher gusts.

However, even with the challenging wind conditions we saw some excellent scores posted in the Pro Class with Mark Huber (WCW Range Member) shooting a perfect 750 in Relay 2.

In the Pro Class Relay 1, WCW Members Harvey Waldron and Mark Huber battled it out for the top spot with Harvey claiming 1st place after shooting an outstanding 747 – 53X. Mark was only 2 shots back shooting an outstanding 745 – 44X. WCW Member Kevin Kellogg claimed 3rd place edging out WCW Member Joe Little by a single point after shooting a very solid 742 – 36X. In the second Relay Mark Huber shot a perfect 750 – 51X for 1st place. Harvey Waldron stayed right with Mark shooting a 749 – 50X missing a perfect score by just 1 point out of 75 shots. However, Harvey won the day with a 6 target total score of 1496 beating Mark by 1 point. Mark had a 6 target total score of 1495. This was outstanding shooting by both Competitors. 3rd

place in Relay 2 went to WCW Member TQ who shot an outstanding 747 – 45X. TQ joined the “oh crap” I forgot to shoot a bull club in August as he forgot to shoot a bull on his 3rd target in Relay 1 losing 10 points. Talal joins WCW Member Keith Wilson who forgot to shoot a bull last month at the July Match. The question on everyone’s minds was who is going to join the “oh crap” I forgot to shoot a bull club in September. Three WCW Members are ranked in the Top 10 nationally for N50: Pro Class - Mark Huber and Harvey Waldron, and Sportsman Class - Keith Wilson. All three of these Competitors will be competing in the N50 National Tournament in Raton, New Mexico the weekend of August 26 & 27. Good luck to them and hopefully they can bring home a couple of Championship trophies.

Steve Read came to the board meeting to ask to reserve the Clubhouse on Thursday nights from 7pm to 9pm mid-November through March for smallbore. Martin said he would check for conflicts and add it to the calendar.

Committee reports:

Notes from the committee reports that were presented during the board meeting are below.

Archery report:

Gabe Shank presented.

Gabe spoke with the JOAD members and they are happy with the scheduling on the calendar.

The archery shack is starting to sink in the rear. They will clean it out this weekend. They would like the WCW employees to help get the blackberry bushes cut out around the shack. Then, the committee will work on fixing it.

The month of July was busy with many tournaments going on.

WSAA held the State Field Championship in Darrington, WA.

NFAA also held the National Field Championship in Darrington, WA.

WCW was well represented in both tournaments. With many of our members taking trophies. Results will be listed when the official scoring is complete.

WCW had a great showing at the Buckeye Classic held in Dublin, Ohio on July 28th-30th. The following are the results.

There have been several requests to hold another 3D shoot in August. The archery committee will determine if this is feasible. Challenges are due to vacations and volunteers.

The targets on the FITA field are being shot up at a higher rate due to the increase of archers on the field. Replacing the cores and target faces will be required. An invoice will be provided for the target faces and materials (liquid rubber foam). This is far cheaper than new targets.

The archery committee has assessed whether the flat range can be moved down to range 4. This will require heavy machinery and remapping the maintenance road. The shelter can be used on the FITA field, but

only about 60-70% of the wood can be recycled. The Flat range can be temporarily moved to the FITA field during construction.

With Summer coming to a close, archery will soon be moving indoors. We want to remind everyone that during an Archery listed practice time, all WCW members are welcome to participate, unless specifically noted on the calendar. Designating a time on the calendar is just a reminder for a group that they are meeting. Individual groups are welcome to rent the facility for private practices.

Handgun Report:

Dave Rusko presented.

Range 3 is cleaned up. Someone shot up the electronics for turning targets. We need to repair that.

We are putting green bins on the ranges for misfires and similar rounds. We will communicate this out.

We will be working on a way to better identify the target lane that matches the booth lane to help prevent cross lane firing. Dave Rusko is going to look into how to fix the chairs in the classroom. They are stained and cannot be cleaned.

We will be setting up Range 3 zone 7 (lanes 25, 26, 27 and 28) for steel targets. We will start without charging to use the steel targets and see how it goes.

We will sell the silhouette targets out of the office. We will try to start doing that next week.

Dave suggested use our Ransom Rest to help people site in their red dots. We would need to purchase grip modules. Dave will investigate it.

Stools at the benches need to be fixed. Dave is going to be working on fixing them.

We will be building a new supply of sandbags.

Dave asked if we could send out an email to members to remind them to pick up after themselves.

They will be cleaning up 228th for the Adopt-a-road program. Snohomish county is interested in putting a picture of our cleaning crew on their website.

Rifle Report:

Martin Morehouse presented.

The next NRA Basic Rifle class is coming up and will be on August 26 th and 27th. Another M1 Garand class will be on the 6th of August.

Thanks to Dave Rusko for cleaning Range 1 and Dave Johnson for numbering the benches in Range 1.

The rifle doping class will be on September 30th. Mike Clark and Jeff Locke are the contacts.

Martin is going to work on coordinating volunteers to teach people how to use their new rifles.

The smallbore shooters would like to use the WCW logo on their shirts. The board said that is fine.

Shotgun Report:

Bill Miele presented.

S&S stock fitting is onsite today. 26 spots are filled. There are 2 spots available.

Bill provided a shotgun clubhouse update.

They took out the kitchen counter and cleaned up the floor. This Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday will be painting.

The next step is to furnish the clubhouse.

We will start with the gun racks and a single console.

Managers Report:

Robert Haverstock presented.

We started digging for the water pipes. We found the maps aren't accurate. They are having to dig to follow the pipes.

Robert will be reaching out to the renters to renew the contract.
