## MEMBERSHIP CORNER

## DONATIONS AND MATCHING FUNDS

As club members, we can get corporate matching from our employers of donations we make to the club. Some employers will also donate funds based on volunteer hours performed by employees or retirees. As an example, Boeing will cash match up to 100% with a minimum, of \$25.00. Volunteer time is paid at \$100.00 per 10 hours worked. Or if teams of 5 or more are volunteering, it is \$20.00 per hour, per team member. Boeing will match 100% per employee per year to a maximum of \$10,00.00 for active employees, and 50% match up to \$3,00 per year for retirees. Check with your employer to see if they offer corporate matching. This could be a good source for donations, as well as increased exposure and recruiting opportunities.

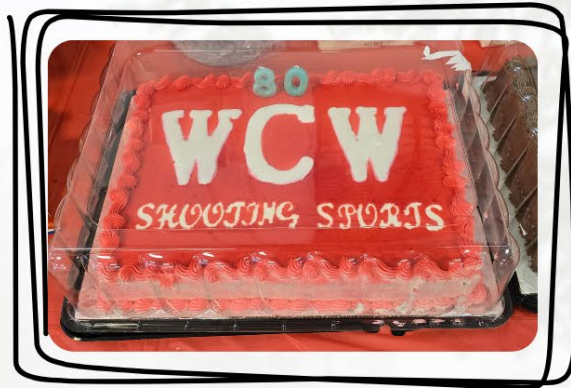

## WCW RIMFIRE MATCH FOR AUGUST 2025

There were 35 contestants in this month's match with eleven competitors in the Expert Division, fourteen in the Sharpshooter Division, seven in the Marksman Division and three in the Rifleman Division.

Relay One Expert Division Target One: Keith Wilson placed first with a score of 247 7X. Mike Becwar was second with a score of 243 4X and Kevin Kellog was third at 242 1X. Target Two: Kathryn Koehler was first with a score of 248 3X and Keith Wilson was second at 242 2X. Mike Becwar finished third with a score of 241 7X.

## THIS IS THE CORRECTED JULY 2025 BENCHREST CENTERFIRE TACK DRIVER MATCH REPORT

The TackDriver Trophy Match consists of shooting both a Group and Score target at 300 yards. The targets used were IBS 200 Yard VFS Target for score and IBS/NBRSA 300 Yard Group Target for group.

There were seventeen contestants in this match with sixteen contestants in the Expert Division and one in the Sharpshooter.

Match 1 : Score: Sean Flores finished first with a match high score of 52. Mohamed Shabar and Troy Rice tied for second with scores of 50. Group: Rob Noges was first with a score of .737 with Teresa Mattingly in second at .754. Bryan Zolnikov was third with a score of .760.

Match 2: Score: There was a four way tie for first place between Pat Farrell, Rob Noges, Bill Rice and P.K. who had scores of 50. Group: Rob Noges with a score of .651. Richard Nicol was second with a score of .797 and P.K. placed third with a score of .804.

Match 3: Score: Jeff Locke placed first with a score of 51. Rick Rogers was second with a score of 50. There was a five way tie for third place between Bryan Zolnikov, Bill Rice, Curt Ibach, Kevin Turner, and Troy Rice with scores of 49. Group: Curt Ibach had a match low score of .573 for first place. Jeff Locke was second with a score of .609 and Kevin Turner came in third at .712.

Match 4: Score: Ken O'Sage had a match high score of 54 for first place. Kevin Turner finished second with a score of 50. There was a seven way tie for third place with scores of 49 between Sean Flores, Jeff Locke, Richard Nicol, Rob Noges, Teresa Mattingly, P.K., and Curt Ibach. Group: Sean Flores and P.K. tied for first with scores of .834. Pat Farrell was third with a score of .886.

The combined score and group aggregate winner was Rob Noges with a total rank score of four points by placing second in score and second in group. P.K. finished second with a total rank score of five points by placing fourth in score and first in group. Sean Flores was third with a total rank score of nine points by placing first in score and eighth in group.

## BULLSEYE PISTOL LEAGUE

We are well into our end of summer/fall bullseye pistol league. There is room on the range, so if you want to try something a bit more challenging, come out on Thursday night and see how it works. If you think bullseye is slow, try the timed and rapid fire stages, with five shots in ten or twenty seconds – accurately!

The matches are 90 shots, starting with three strings of 10 shots each in slow fire, then ten in timed fire, ten in rapid fire, then two strings of ten each in timed fire, and ending in two strings of ten shots each in rapid fire. We had two new shooters join us last week, come out and improve your pistol shooting through competition.

## CMP GAMES HIGHPOWER MATCH

Our second NRA Highpower match this year was on 17 August.

Aaron Sporseen scored 377-2X, even with a cartridge-over-bolt jam in an AR.

Milt Schneider scored the second highest, with a 418, using an AR.

Robert Shuey got the top score this time, with 450 and his AR.

Josh Jordan is still working with his Garand, and scored 409-2X.

Our next NRA Highpower match, and our last for the year, will be on 21 September, we rescheduled it from October. Bring your rifle and 60 rounds, come out and learn how we do it. Competition builds skill!

## AUGUST 2025 BENCHREST CENTERFIRE MATCH REPORT

There were eighteen contestants in this month's 300-yard benchrest match with six in the Expert Division and twelve contestants in the Sharpshooter Division.

The first relay consisted of six Expert Division shooters. The second relay consisted of twelve Sharpshooter Division shooters.

Welcome to newcomers Bruce Nguyen, Dien Luu, Tri Tran, Mark Sagar, and Bill Ritchie.

To accommodate the larger fields, the target boards have been built to accommodate two targets. The competitors shoot targets one and two with a five-minute break between them followed by shooting targets three and four with the same five-minute break.

The weather conditions were cool temperatures with gusty winds.



#### Relay 1 Expert Division:

Joe Maggiora presented. Joe M. shared details of the budget.

#### **Vice-President's report:**

Dave Rusko discussed proposed new policy changes, project status including the deck rebuild and the front gate repair, and our search for replacement maintenance equipment. We have a lot of area to mow, and need a mower capable of the work.

#### Rifle Report:

The following content was provided by Martin Morehouse and was shared outside of the board meeting.

Rifle matches for the coming month are Rimfire Benchrest on 2 August, ARA Rimfire Match on 9 August, Centerfire Benchrest match on 16 August, and an NRA Highpower match on 17 August. Project Appleseed will hold a 25m rifle clinic on 23 – 24 August.

The next NRA Basic Rifle class will be on 23-24 August. Indoor smallbore practice is on the calendar on Tuesdays and Fridays from 6 to 9 PM, and weekends from 2 – 6 PM.

Twelve members attended the rifle special use class in July. The August Rifle Special Use range session is on the 24th. Special use will no longer expire after seven years. We will update the policy manual to show this.

Mortenson will hold another event for 20-25 people at shotgun on 13 August. We put it on the schedule.

We have volunteers working on steel target maintenance as their time allows. Jeff

McGee/Non-Ferrous Metals picked up the lead removed from the clubhouse traps, will get it smelted and cast soon. Do we need to sell the resulting lead like we do the range brass?

We propose to offer the NRA CCW course at WCW. This class is an introduction to safely carrying, drawing, and shooting a pistol from concealment. As Washington state training requirements change, this will let us prepare to offer future classes and support customer needs. This class would use the Pistol Range classroom and Range 3, the pistol range. The class takes two days, with each day starting in the classroom, and about three hours each afternoon on the range. The class will need exclusive access to the range for those hours, as the students will be drawing and shooting holstered pistols from a firing line in front of the existing shooting positions. We work with no less than a 1 instructor to 2 student ratio so that every student is under direct supervision at all times. The class has a maximum size of eight students. We would like to offer our first class with only four students as a demonstration and proof of proof of concept for our facilities here. Our instructors are qualified WCW and NRA instructors with experience presenting this class at other locations. We have

successfully offered training like this at WCW in the past, with LEOSA qualifications and a carbine class for Securite.

John Woolley will set up WCW as a USAShooting affiliate club, to improve opportunities for the junior rifle program.

##### Old Business:

Anniversary and Member Celebration Update

Justin Kisle reviewed our progress so far. We are under budget, but haven't bought the meats for our barbecue. Joe Rinaldi and Justin's mother have volunteered to cook. Jack Bobin is planning for the prize drawing, has several impressive prizes lined up. We discussed how to organize the prize drawings. We have events and activities planned, will be starting at the clubhouse and guiding members to the events from there. Justin also proposed member rates for classes for instructors and organizers of events we host here, such as Appleseed, Next Step Archery, and similar groups.

Concealed Carry Training proposal

Martin Morehouse proposed that we offer NRA CCW classes here. This class is an introduction to safely carrying, drawing, and shooting a holstered pistol from concealment. This class would use the Pistol Range classroom and Range 3, the pistol range. The class takes two days, with each day starting in the classroom, and about three hours each afternoon on the range. The class will need exclusive access to the range for those hours, as the students will be drawing and shooting holstered pistols from a firing line in front of the existing shooting positions. There were no objections.

##### Guests:

Mahlon Dunnell/Steppe Up Archery proposed conducting individual archery classes as an instructor here, as our location is more convenient for his students. He would like to charge less than our normal day rate for guests. He will write up a proposal for the board, and coordinate with the archery committee on details.
