President's Message

Now that the Christmas Holiday Season is behind us, it's time we start planning for the busy year ahead. We have an **important Members' Meeting scheduled for Wednesday, January 14 th at 7:00 PM**. Please mark your calendar and plan to join us in the Clubhouse so we can make you aware of the new projects we are planning, improvements we are making to our Ranges, and the additional training opportunities we will be offering in 2026.

Tax Season will soon be here, so this is a good time to remind you that our 501.c.3 Tax status allows you to make Tax Deductible donations to our Club. Directly related to our fundraising efforts is the expansion of our Youth Programs. At our January 2026 Members Meeting we will share what we are putting in place for our kids in each Shooting Discipline, including Archery and Air Gun. We will need adult volunteers and additional revenue to support these programs so consider donating what you can (time, money or both) to ensure their success.

Take a little time each month to check our Club Calendar for some of the new Training Classes we are launching this year. The Board is working diligently to make these classes relevant for every age group and address some areas that have been neglected such as Air Rifle use and training. We are also adding a Concealed Carry Handgun Course for those who are considering the legal and moral responsibility associated with carrying a firearm for self-defense. In the State of Washington, we are constantly under pressure

from Olympia Lawmakers who have all but declared war on Gun Owners and the Second Amendment. Every year the Legislature rolls out new restrictions, requirements and taxes on purchasing, owning and using firearms. If you have an interest in monitoring these proposed Bills and the politics behind them and reporting updates and calls to action to our members, please let me or one of the other Board Members know. The Continental Shotgun League Shoot hosted by our Club is scheduled for February 22d, starting time is 9:00 am. All Active WCW Club Members are not only welcome but encouraged to participate. The cost is \$42 for 4 rounds (100 targets) of two-shot Continental Trap. Ladies and Juniors can opt to shoot two rounds (50) targets at a reduced cost. If you want to experience a competitive shooting event, with no strings attached, come out alone or with your family, and shoot with us. It will be a fun and enjoyable experience you won't soon forget. For those of you who shoot shotgun after the sun goes down, we have good news; we are replacing our antiquated outdoor lighting infrastructure. The project has Board approval and will begin as soon as the associated hardware is received, and an installation date can be secured with our contractor. So glad to finally address this long-awaited improvement at our Shotgun Range!

Remember, always check our website for closure announcements, special events and

operating hours before you head out to the range. Weather-related closures are not uncommon during the Winter months; high winds, snow, unusually cold temperatures and ice can result in unscheduled range closure.

DONATIONS AND MATCHING FUNDS

As club members, we can get corporate matching from our employers of donations we make to the club. Some employers will also donate funds based on volunteer hours performed by employees or retirees. As an example, Boeing will cash match up to 100% with a minimum, of \$25.00. Volunteer time is paid at \$100.00 per 10 hours worked. Or if teams of 5 or more are volunteering, it is \$20.00 per hour, per team member. Boeing will match 100% per employee per year to a maximum of \$10,00.00 for active employees, and 50% match up to \$3,00 per year for retirees. Check with your employer to see if they offer corporate matching. This could be a good source for donations, as well as increased exposure and recruiting opportunities.

MEMBERSHIP BADGES

When you join the club, or when you renew your membership, you get a new membership badge. Membership badges will be mailed to your address of record.

SPECIAL USE NO LONGER EXPIRES

You are always welcome to attend a classroom or range session as a refresher.

You must possess a working gate key if you are on the range during member hours.

Don't forget to sign in at each range you use every time you visit. This way we can find out how busy each range is, and help us plan for future activities.

MEMBERSHIP CORNER

New members are always welcome here, we don't have a restricted membership. Let your friends know the benefits of joining us. Membership is a good deal, we offer facilities and shooting opportunities that are hard to find locally. Some of these are only open to members.

Our individual membership still costs only \$297.00, and the family membership is only \$386.10, and each requires a \$200.00 initiation fee. BULLSEYE PISTOL LEAGUE

Our indoor bullseye pistol league restarts after the Christmas and New Years breaks on 8 January, and continues through the end of March 2026. We have room for a few more competitors, so if you want to try something more challenging, come out and see how it works. The first relay starts at 7:00 PM and the second relay at 8:15 PM, first come, first served. If we need to, we can run a third relay. We will be shooting in the IERPA Postal League again and will try to field 12 teams. The cost for this league is \$80 per shooter.

This is fired with .22 pistols, one handed, at 50 feet in the clubhouse. If you still think bullseye shooting is slow, try the timed and rapid fire stages, with five shots in ten or twenty seconds offhand – accurately!

The matches are 90 shots, starting with three strings of 10 shots each in slow fire, then ten in timed fire, ten in rapid fire, then two strings of ten each in timed fire, and ending in two strings of ten shots each in rapid fire. Come out and improve your pistol shooting through competition.

The Shotgun Committee would like to report that we have had a good year, and particularly that our members have done well. Mike Wilgus is coming off a great year with several 2nd place finishes in Georgia, Europe, and finished with the National Sporting Clays Association, National Championship.

In other events, Tim Lade put together an amazing 5-Stand League on Monday nights that had between 25 and 35 shooters for its duration. Being on the 5-Stand, we had a Trapper, so public shooters as well as members could compete. Mike won it, but the competition was fierce and everyone is looking forward to more of them.

We ran a Members League on Thursday nights. It was put together a bit too quickly, and a number of the initial shooters had work and other obligations that pulled them away. We will be sure to plan and announce it earlier to insure anyone can join in the fun. The format was 50 birds of Doubles, 25 bird Continental and 25 bird 16yd Singles. The top spots were closely contested, and while there were two levels of competitors, scores were very tight within the groups. Jim Storlie won the Doubles competition buckle by one bird over Mike O'Malley. The buckles for 16yd Singles, Continental and High Overall were taken by Mike O'Malley, but the top 4 places were within a dozen birds of each other. It was a fun Thursday night event. We plan to reintroduce the leagues again, after getting input from the membership to insure we have a day and time that allows many more shooters to join in the fun. Thursday nights were an open time, but only allowed for Members, which kept a number of shooters from joining us. We started a Mentored Doubles practice on Trap 2 each Saturday at 10 AM. Ed Munson has been helping shooters develop their skills. We have added more shooters with almost every session, from beginners who want to try it, to seasoned competitors who want to come and practice for the upcoming shoots. It is a fun time, where squads rotate quickly and shoot 2-6 lines before many of the public shooters show up. If you would like to learn or just improve your Doubles skills, come out and meet up with us at Trap 2. We have the Continental League travelling through a number of clubs in the Northwest. You can travel the circuit or just shoot the clubs you wish to. Rich Wasserman and Jimmie Dinnie have offered to mentor any shooters who wish to learn Continental. If you see them, ask if you can squad up with them and learn to shoot Continental. It is a bit wider range of angles and speed, but you get 2 shots at the bird. Our members have been travelling down to the Sumner Sportsman's Association club for their "Alien Invasion" shoot under the blacklights. This runs from 6-9 pm on Saturday Nights. We have posters on the doors to the shotgun range with the dates. We are working to set this up for alternate Saturdays from Sumner's shoots, as we had done some testing earlier, and everyone was enjoying it. We plan to have a safe, fun and interesting shoot with this format. It is rapidly becoming an after dark sensation. We are working on improved lighting for the Shotgun range, and replacing some of the older traps on the 5-Stand. These are investments to make the range more efficient and insure the shooting experience remains as enjoyable as we can make it.

Finally, I would like to thank all of our members who have helped with our programs, from Tim Lade and his crew making the 5-Stand League a great success, Cameron Jones, Trevor Reite, Paul Kalman and Ed Munson who helped set up and run the Members Trap League, and Members Nights as well as all our members who help out by assisting guests at the range to feel welcomed and helped to get the most enjoyment out of their shooting experience. 7:15 PM: Scott Ray, 2026 Planning and near-term Goals

- Events and Promotional Activities – Scheduling and Leadership: - Activities must be scheduled on the calendar to ensure adequate planning time for resourcing and promotional efforts.
- Infrastructure Improvements – Near Term Requirements - Secure buy-in for improvements with completion target by end of 2026.
- Membership Growth Targets – 2026 Goal Setting - Determine whether to establish a 2026 membership goal with associated program requirements. Plan discussion for January 2026.
- Youth Sports – 2026 Priority - Make youth sports a priority across all disciplines for 2026.

7:30 PM: Joe Maggiora

- Joe recommended not increasing the Line fees and membership dues since the financial numbers were looking healthy.
- Information security policy attestation for credit card processor needs review and signature, needs somebody from the Board to take a look into this.
- WCW Shooting Sports Board the Monthly Financials for the first eight months of FY 2025-2026, noting that the overall income for the period is -\$15.6K compared to -\$57.7K in the previous year, with bank accounts up \$50.6K.

- Joe Maggiora mentioned he will meet with the accountant on 12/10 to reconcile inventories and depreciation schedules and that overall, the Treasury is up 2.7% from last year.
- The Finance Committee met on 12/2 and will recommend no increases in member dues or range fees for 2026, as the actual net income of -\$15.6K is well below the budgeted net income of -\$110.3K as of 11/30.
- Joe Maggiora also advised the Board to begin canvassing membership for a new Treasurer as he will not be running for re- election in April 2026.

7:40 PM: Dave Rusko

- Operations and Facility Goals for 2026 – Maintenance Manager Hire – Range improvements: - We are down from 2 fulltime to 1 fulltime maintenance/groundskeeper. Current staff is not skilled enough to take this on. This will be split into Groundskeeping and maintenance group reporting into Robert. This will have to be full-time roles with wages. Robert and Dave are working out the details.
- Employee reviews were completed and bonus cheques were shared with them. 2.8% Cost of living adjustment and 3% flat wage increase of 5.8% per employee was completed. There was no grading of employees done this time and is slated to be done next year once employee handbook is finalized.

□ 2025 Accomplishments, Completed Projects

- o Range office deck remodel was completed; contractor deliverables are completed and did a good job. They will be returning next spring for cleaning and protective coating.
- o Shotgun Reefer: - Replaced rotted out boards and resealed and repainted, this was an eagle scout project and the work was completed in 2 days.
- o Rifle 2 range refresh is completed. Chains have been put-up between the red painted zone and the space behind the range ensuring the safety bar is raised during ceasefire.
- o WCW is partnering with Nock and Fire 4H archery for the Youth program.
- o Dave shared the new webpage under development: - <https://wcwssports.wpenginepowered.com/>
- o Estimates are in for retrofit of lighting for Shotgun 5 stand and trap fields and is \$27,630.12 which includes \$3250 discount rebate from PUD. Dave made the motion to do similar upgrades for Archery with the committed budget for a total of \$35000. Seconded by Kevin Ekstrom. Motion passed unanimously.

□ Year-end Project Status – Membership Badge Issuance

- o Badge issuance immediately post orientation has been sorely needed rather than getting mailed in, this will be operational by 1 Jan by training the personnel.
- o RFID, or similar, Range Access and data acquisition: - Technology is being explored of what to implement, it opens up the possibility of integration with the current facial recognition and/or RGP, this is currently in exploratory phase.
- o Training Expansion - Active training and education on every weekend is the goal for 2026 considering the interest seen in 2025 and the revenue generation capabilities.

7:55 PM: Committee Chair Reports

Finance – Contract Labor expansion is expected going into 2026 for general associated tasks with the accounting firm.

Audit – Joe shared that he is meeting with the new accountant 12/10.

Teller – Nothing to report.

Shooting Sports Advisory

- Club Owned Shotgun Assets – Policy regarding usage – Maintenance policy is needed for all the assets, list of member mentors will be shared by Fred who would need to know the standard operating procedures for the range, equipment which will help free up the range resources to address the members/paid members who are waiting.
- Martin Morehouse:- CCW Class Program Proposal/Proof of Concept: - 11/30 CCW Proof of concept class was conducted, this was successful and met the objective with 100% pass rate and can be made a

monthly recurrence offering for up to 8 people at a time. Scott raised the safety concerns and wanted to discuss this further with Martin and others involved to ensure we are able to adhere to it as we scale it up further.
