If you can dedicate just one day a month to assisting us in this effort you will be making an invaluable

contribution to the Club. We are expanding our Basic Training opportunities with new intermediate and advanced classes so we can offer meaningful programs that develop useful skill sets for our members and the Public alike. Our Annual Members Meeting is coming up April 13, 2026. Please mark this date on your Calendar and plan to attend. We will give you a full financial report on our Club, data that shows where our Shooting Disciplines rank in order of participation and profitability, our membership status as related to each shooting category, our Budget for the current 2026-2027 year and the improvements we have scheduled for this period. We have a lot to cover but out of respect for our members' time we keep our meetings limited to 60-90 minutes.

Tax Season will soon be here and that usually includes planning for the following year, so with that in mind, we want to remind you that our 501.c.3 Tax status allows you to **make Tax Deductible donations to WCW**. Additional details are generally available in our monthly Newsletters but never hesitate to contact our Board Members if you want to speak to us in real time. As I mentioned last month, we are putting a lot of effort into our Youth Programs. At our January 2026 Members Meeting we shared our plan for Youth participation in each Shooting Discipline, including Archery and Air Gun. We will need adult volunteers and additional revenue to

support these programs so consider donating what you can (time, money or both to ensure their success.

This month we are launching our Concealed Carry Handgun Course for those who are considering the legal and moral responsibility associated with carrying a firearm for self-defense. Concealed Carry requires a different skill set, so this is a great place to start that development. This Class includes rapid fire drills that illustrate how effective you are, or are not, under mild duress. Check the Club Calendar for details.

The Continental Shotgun League Shoot hosted by our Club is scheduled for February 22 and starting time is 9:00 am. **All Active WCW Club Members are welcome and strongly encouraged to participate.** The cost is \$42 for 4 rounds (100 targets) of two-shot Continental Trap. Ladies and Juniors can opt to shoot two rounds (50) targets at a reduced cost. If you want to experience a competitive shooting event, with no strings attached, come out and shoot with us. For those of you who shoot shotgun after the sun goes down, our new lights have been installed, and the improvement is dramatic making shooting after dark a rewarding experience and a lot of fun.

Remember, always check our website for closure announcements, special events and operating hours before you head out to the range. Weather-related closures are not uncommon during the Winter months; high winds, snow, unusually cold temperatures and ice can result in unscheduled range closure.

You are always welcome to attend a classroom or range session as a refresher.

You must possess a working gate key if you are on the range during member hours.

Don't forget to sign in at each range you use every time you visit. This helps us know how busy each range is, and help us plan for future activities.

WCW RIMFIRE MATCH FOR JANUARY 2026

There were 28 contestants in this month's match with Eleven competitors in the Expert Division, thirteen in the Sharpshooter Division, seven in the Marksman Division and one in the Rifleman Division. The wind conditions were very calm which led to some exceptional scores.

On the first target nine of the ten competitors shot scores of 240 or higher. On the second target nine of the ten competitors again shot targets of 240 or higher.

Relay One Expert Division Target One: Don Smith placed first with a score of 247 8X. Keith Wilson finished second at 247 5X and Kathryn Koehler placed third at 246 10X. Target Two: Ernie Snyder placed first with a score of 243 2X. Keith Wilson and Don Smith tied for second with scores of 242 5X.

BULLSEYE PISTOL LEAGUE

Our indoor bullseye pistol league is well under way, and continues through the end of March 2026. We have room for a few more competitors, so if you want to try something more challenging, come out and see how it works. We changed our times to make room for more shooters, we now start at 6:15, with the second relay at 7:30, first come, first served. If we need to, we can run a third relay. We are be shooting in the IERPA Postal League again and would like to field 12 teams. The cost for this league is \$80 per shooter.

This is fired with .22 pistols, one handed, at 50 feet in the clubhouse. If you still think bullseye shooting is slow, try the timed and rapid fire stages, with five shots in ten or twenty seconds offhand – accurately!

The matches are 90 shots, starting with three strings of 10 shots each in slow fire, then ten in timed fire, ten in rapid fire, then two strings of ten each in timed fire, and ending in two strings of ten shots each in rapid fire. Come out and improve your pistol shooting through competition.

SHOTGUN UPDATE

The month of January has been a good one for the Shotgun Range. We are happy to have Gary take over the Shotgun Rangemaster position. With this change, Briley has taken over the 5-Stand position, and these changes have been well received.

After long discussions about improvements to the range, we have been able to upgrade the lights on the Trap Field and 5-Stand to LED overhead spotlights. These have made an amazing improvement. There are no shadows and the brightness makes shooting better than daylight at times. If you haven't come out to shoot in the evenings, you will be pleasantly surprised with the upgrade. We are also in the process of upgrading some of the trap on 5-Stand. These traps have served us well for many years, but they are getting old and we are working with a vendor to replace them with newer traps to improve reliability and types of throws. Tim Lade has been working on this to insure that our 5-Stand is challenging and fun.

We have been running a Trap Doubles practice on Saturday Mornings from 10am till noon. This is open to members and public shooters. Ed Munson has been mentoring the shooters and we have seen a great increase in Doubles shooting. Ed has been shooting amazing scores with a Reminton 870 pump shotguns. This is a great opportunity to come shoot one of the 3 competition formats of PITA and ATA competition. Pump, O/U or Semiautomatic shotguns work well for this. We are building a nice community of shooters who come and start their weekend with a few rounds of Doubles and then slide over to shoot Trap, Continental or 5-Stand. Pick up a Doubles card and come join us in the fun.

We will be hosting the Continental League round at Kenmore on February 22nd. We are looking for 12 volunteers to score, sweep up hulls and help load traps during the shoot. This is an opportunity to see some of the Northwest's best Continental shooters, including some of our members and learn more about Continental shooting.

ARA 2025 SEASON RECAP

As we close out another successful year of ARA shooting in Washington State, we want to take a moment to recognize what has been an outstanding season for both our marksmen and our club. This marks our third year hosting ARA events at WCW, and in 2025 we successfully ran a full schedule of 12 matches—an achievement that reflects the dedication and passion of everyone involved.

Washington continues to prove that it is home to some of the best rimfire shooters in the country. Building on last year's momentum, highlighted by David Konkle's National Championship win in the Factory Outdoor Aggregate, our shooters once again delivered at the highest levels of competition. This year, Harvey Waldron III—our Washington State Unlimited Outdoor Champion—finished an impressive 8th place nationally, with Mark Huber close behind in 18th in the unlimited aggregate division and 16th in the Combined Unlimited and Factory category.

Why is this significant? Nationally there are 1060 Unlimited and 1419 Factory Competitors.

We are especially proud of our own Bryan Schremp, who ranked 5th nationally in the Factory Outdoor Aggregate. Congratulations are also well deserved for Jeff Kalina, David Konkle, Pat Beireis, and Chris Walker, all of whom finished in the top 20 nationally in that same category.

At the state level, Harvey Waldron III secured the Unlimited Outdoor title for the third consecutive year, with Mark Huber and TAQ earning second and third place honors. In Factory Outdoor, Pat Beireis claimed a hard-earned first place after a phenomenal season, followed by Kevin Watson in second and Chris Walker in third.

None of this would be possible without the tireless work behind the scenes. On behalf of the entire club, we extend a sincere thank you to our scoring team—Mathew Daly and Kevin Kellog—who volunteered their time at every match and tournament hosted at WCW this year.

In 2026, we are expanding again. Coordinating with other ARA Clubs in WA State we will also be hosting an ARA area Tournament in addition to the Washington State Tournament.

Thank you to all competitors, volunteers, and supporters who made this season such a success. We look forward to building on this momentum and continuing to raise the bar in the year ahead.

To accommodate the larger fields, the target boards have been built to accommodate two targets. The competitors shoot targets one and two with a five-minute break between them followed by shooting targets three and four with the same five-minute break.
