## President's Message

Our Annual Members Meeting is coming up April 13, 2026, at 7:00 PM in the Clubhouse. It is my sincere hope that our members will attend this meeting and provide our Board of Directors with much needed feedback and recommendations. Please note this correction: According to our Bylaws, elections for several Board positions will occur **next year (2027)**. One-year terms apply to some positions while others serve for two following an even/odd yearly format. Until then, the Board will appoint replacements as needed for those Directors unable to complete their terms. At this meeting the Board will be providing a financial summary of our Club, data that shows where our Shooting Disciplines rank in order of revenue, our membership status and our Budget for our current 2026-2027 fiscal year. There are numerous improvements we have scheduled for this period, and we will be sharing that project information as well. As you can see, we have a lot to cover, but out of respect for our members' time and commitments we limit these meetings to 60-90 minutes.

**Tax Season** has arrived and that usually includes planning for your 2026 tax year. With that in mind, we want to remind you that our 501.c.3 Tax status allows you to make **Tax Deductible donations to WCW**. For those of you who enjoy the Shotgun Sports, we had a good turnout for our Continental Shoot on Sunday February 22 nd . Competition provides motivation to improve your skills in a friendly, supportive environment. The good news is WCW will sponsor a 16-yard Trap/Continental Spring League starting April 12th that will run for 7 weeks. Remember, this month we are launching our **Concealed Carry Handgun Course** for those who are considering the legal and moral responsibility associated with carrying a firearm for self-defense. Concealed Carry requires a different skill set, so this is a great place to start that development. This Class includes rapid fire drills that illustrate how effective you are, or are not, under mild duress. Check the Club Calendar for details.

## RANGE REMINDER

Our members are our eyes. If you see a range rule violation, especially a safety violation, let people know, let a rangemaster know. We all need reminders at times. All of us together keep things safe, and more eyes are better.

Range 1 Steel Targets: Do not leave steel targets set up on the range. Move them to the east or west storage areas after use. STEEL TARGET SHOTS MUST BE BELOW 2650FPS AT THE TARGET. Know your ballistics!

Please contact [info@wcwshootingsports.org](mailto:info@wcwshootingsports.org) before bringing in any items for donation or sharing. If you bring something to share, take it home when you are done. Anything left at the range will be disposed of or sold to support our youth programs. Lost and Found items are kept at the Range office for 30 days.

Report any damage to club equipment, infrastructure, or the range, however minor. Tell a Range Master or complete an incident form (blue folder by sign-in sheet) and turn in at the range office. We can't fix it if we don't know it's broken.

We recently had an apparent negligent discharge on Range 1. A shot was fired into the platform in the east bay, damaging it. The member who fired the shot did not report it. It will take more than duct tape to fix this. If you cause damage or even see damage to our facilities, let us know so we can get things back in shape.

Target Two: Mike Becwar placed first again with a score of 246 5X. David Seibert placed second again at 244 6X and Don Smith was third at 242 6X.

Relay Two Sharpshooter Division: Target One. Barry Johnson placed first with a score of 241 2X. Scott Price came in second at 239 3X. Bruce Baillee placed third at 236 2X. Target Two: Jason Pahlman placed first at 244 3X with Barry Johnson in second 242 5X. Scott Price was third at 235 7X.

## BULLSEYE PISTOL LEAGUE

Our indoor bullseye pistol league is well under way, and continues through the end of March 2026. We have room for a few more competitors, so if you want to try something more challenging, come out and see how it works. We changed our times to make room for more shooters, we now start at 6:15, with the second relay at 7:30, first come, first served. If we need to, we can run a third relay. We are shooting in the IERPA Postal League again and would like to field 12 teams. The cost for this league is \$80 per shooter.

The matches are 90 shots, starting with three strings of 10 shots each in slow fire, then ten in timed fire, ten in rapid fire, then two strings of ten each in timed fire, and ending in two strings of ten shots each in rapid fire. Come out and improve your pistol shooting through competition.

This is fired with .22 pistols, one handed, at 50 feet in the clubhouse. If you still think bullseye shooting is slow, try the timed and rapid fire stages, with five shots in ten or twenty seconds offhand – accurately!

## SHOTGUN UPDATE

The month of January has been a good one for the Shotgun Range. We are happy to have Gary take over the Shotgun Rangemaster position. With this change, Briley has taken over the 5-Stand position, and these changes have been well received.

After long discussions about improvements to the range, we have been able to upgrade the lights on the Trap Field and 5-Stand to LED overhead spotlights. These have made an amazing improvement. There are no shadows and the brightness makes shooting better than daylight at times. If you haven't come out to shoot in the evenings, you will be pleasantly surprised with the upgrade. We are also in the process of upgrading some of the trap on 5-Stand. These traps have served us well for many years, but they are getting old and we are working with a vendor to replace them with newer traps to improve reliability and types of throws. Tim Lade has been working on this to insure that our 5-Stand is challenging and fun.

We have been running a Trap Doubles practice on Saturday Mornings from 10am till noon. This is open to members and public shooters. Ed Munson has been mentoring the shooters and we have seen a great increase in Doubles shooting. Ed has been shooting amazing scores with a Reminton 870 pump shotguns. This is a great opportunity to come shoot one of the 3 competition formats of PITA and ATA competition. Pump, O/U or Semiautomatic shotguns work well for this. We are building a nice community of shooters who come and start their weekend with a few rounds of Doubles and then slide over to shoot Trap, Continental or 5-Stand. Pick up a Doubles card and come join us in the fun.

We will be hosting the Continental League round at Kenmore on February 22nd. We are looking for 12 volunteers to score, sweep up hulls and help load traps during the shoot. ## FEBRUARY 2026 BENCHREST CENTERFIRE MATCH REPORT

There were eighteen contestants in this month's 300-yard benchrest match with eight in the Expert Division and ten Sharpshooter Division.

The first relay consisted of eight Expert Division shooters and one Marksmanship Division shooters. The second relay consisted of nine Sharpshooter Division shooters.

To accommodate the larger fields, the target boards have been built to accommodate two targets. The competitors shoot targets one and two with a five-minute break between them followed by shooting targets three and four with the same five-minute break.

The weather conditions were mild, with gusty winds and the temperature at about 40 degrees.

### Relay 1 Expert Division:

Target 1: Jeff Locke was first with a score of 105. Ken O'Sage was second with a score of 101. Kahn Nguyen and Ernie Snyder tied for third place with scores of 100.

Target 2: Ken O'Sage finished first with a score of 105. Bill Rice and Kahn Nguyen tied for second at 103.

Target 3: Jeff Locke was first with a score of 100. Ken O'Sage and Kahn Nguyen tied for second with scores of 99.

Target 4: Jeff Locke was first with a score of 106 and the only competitor to have four target scores of 100 or better. Ken O'Sage and Kahn Nguyen tied for second with scores of 100.

### Relay 2 Sharpshooter Division:

Target 1: Tim Turner was first with a score of 98. Loren Boyd and Matt Daly tied for second at 97.

Target 2: Loren Boyd and Matt Daly tied for first with scores of 101. Tim Turner and Jason Ingram tied for second with scores of 99 each.

Target 3: Loren Boyd placed first with a score of 103. Matt Daly was second at 98. James Brittin, Jason Ingram, and Tim Turner tied for third with scores of 97.

Target 4: Matt Daly placed first with a score of 101. Loren Boyd and Nathan Hood tied for second at 98.

In the Expert Division Jeff Locke was the match winner with a score of 411. Ken O'Sage finished second with a score of 405. Kahn Nguyen placed third with a score of 402.

In the Sharpshooter Division Loren Boyd finished first with a score of 399. Matt Daly was second at 397.

## WCW BOARD MEETING MINUTES – FEBRUARY 4, 2026

Our meeting minutes were lost in a computer failure, what follows is the agenda we used going into the meeting.

February 4, 2026 BoD Meeting Topics

### 1. Membership:

1.1. We have been renewing long expired memberships (multiple years expired) without charging the new membership initiation fee. Is this how we want to continue?

1.1.1. As membership freezes are available to all members, any long term event greater than 30 days that prevents a member from participating in club activities qualifies that member to freeze their membership. Members that do not freeze their membership account prior to expiration will have a period of 2 years in which to renew at the current renewal rate and the initiation fee will be waived. All long lapsed memberships greater than 2 years from date of membership expiration will require all members to attend New Member Orientation before their renewal will be accepted.

1.1.1.1. The board voted unanimously to waive the initiation fee for lapsed membership reinstatement.

1.2. We still have a grandfathered exception to minor children on family memberships. We permitted dependents to remain on family memberships to the age of 26 if they are enrolled full time in undergraduate higher education. This exception has been removed from the newly adopted ByLaws.

1.2.1. The grandfathered exception to minor children remaining as dependents to the age of 26 if full time graduate students will be honored for all remaining active members that do not have a lapse in membership. These persons must establish Individual Membership in WCW in order to enjoy club privileges and responsibilities if they leave their undergraduate program.

1.2.1.1. The board voted unanimously to honor existing dependent memberships for minors age 26 and younger that are enrolled full time in undergraduate higher education.

1.3. We have been allowing members over the age of 65 years to renew at the senior rate without enforcing the continuous membership rule. "Qualifying Discount: Senior – 1/2 Dues if age 65 or older and member for 5 consecutive years"

1.3.1. Once a senior member meets the 5 consecutive year rule, do we continue to extend the discount if their membership lapses?

1.3.1.1. As membership freezes are available to all members, any long term event greater than 30 days that prevents a member from participating in club activities qualifies that member to freeze their membership. Members that do not freeze their membership account prior to expiration will have a period of 2 years in which to renew at the current renewal rate and the initiation fee will be waived. All long lapsed memberships greater than 2 years from date of membership expiration will require all members to attend New Member Orientation before their renewal will be accepted.

1.3.2. All members are now required to have a photo on their badge regardless of age. (parental abstention permitted)

1.3.3. We are now printing new members badges immediately after new member orientation.

1.3.4. We are now printing RPSU badges after the monthly Rifle Range qualification class for immediate distribution.

1.3.5. We are working towards all badge printing being done at the range office in real time.

1.3.6. We are still missing an Archery Special Use qualification process on the club webpage.

### 2. Right to Use the facilities:

2.1. We do not check public shooters for legally permitted to possess a firearm. Should we?

2.1.1. To ensure compliance with all federal, state, and local laws, this topic will be considered in upcoming committee meetings to determine the actions or changes needed to ensure WCW is protected from liability.

### 3. Space availability

3.1. Clubhouse, Pistol Classroom, Chalet and Shotgun Clubhouse are all in high demand. We are prioritizing Training and Education per Scott's direction to continue to expand our shooting sports outreach to the community.

3.1.1. Several reports have been received of training classes overlapping with calendered events and spaces not being available when calendered.

3.1.1.1. We have reached out to the instructors and event coordinators to reaffirm that their classes must start and complete within the allotted time scheduled. (Setup/Teardown buffer time) ["unavailable" flag?]

3.1.1.1.1. We will be implementing a "class schedule request" tool that will resolve any scheduling conflicts.

3.2. The clubhouse has been used by primarily archers during times that are not calendered. Are airgun, pistol, and rifle users permitted the same use currently?

3.2.1. Current policy "Wildlife Committee of Washington CLUBHOUSE INDOOR RANGE SAFETY RULES Safety is everyone's responsibility. Each shooter will observe and comply with the following rules:

1. The clubhouse range is for supervised shooting events only. There will be a WCW Coach, Instructor, or authorized Match Director/Supervisor directly in charge of any shooting activity on the clubhouse range.

3.2.1.1. Dave Rusko commented that per president Scott Ray's directive, "Training and Education and Rentals of space will take priority over members' open shooting time" We need to discuss this amongst the committee chairs and event coordinators to ensure facility usage is fair to all. This will be discussed in greater detail at regularly scheduled Shooting Sports Advisory Committee meetings. A suggestion was made to consider creating a Clubhouse Special Use endorsement.

### 4. NRA class course restructuring

4.1.1. NRA Basic courses (12-18 hours) being moved from monthly schedule to monthly alternating or quarterly schedule.

4.1.1.1. Releases weekend reservation times with low/no attendance for other instruction classes.

4.1.1.2. Still allows WCW to maintain its NRA Instructor certification training track.

4.1.2. First Steps classes (3-5 hours) now calendered for Pistol, Rifle, Shotgun

4.1.3. New Class offerings

4.1.3.1. First Steps Rifle

4.1.3.2. Refuse to be a Victim (pending instructor assignment)

4.1.3.3. Shotgun Reloading (pending instructor assignment)

4.1.3.4. Muzzleloader/Blackpowder (Committee and Shooting group formation in progress)

4.1.3.5. USCCA Basic Defensive Pistol and Legal Use of Force

4.1.3.6. \*USCCA Defensive Pistol Practical Practice

4.1.3.7. Next Steps Rifle/Pistol/Shotgun

4.1.3.8. \*Meet your Firearm

4.1.3.9. Shotgun Doubles Practice

4.1.3.10. Shotgun Blacklight Shooting

4.1.3.11. Shotgun Handicap Practice

4.1.3.12. Shotgun 5-Stand Introduction

4.1.3.13. Youth Archery (pending course development)

### 5. Google WorkSpace Account

5.1. We are currently paying \$8.40/month/user for our Google WorkSpace subscription:

5.1.1.  $\$8.40 \times 26 \text{ seats} = \$218.40 + \text{tax per month} = \$2620 + \text{tax per year}$

5.2. We may be able to qualify for a Google WorkSpace for non-profits at a reduced fee or no charge. Meeting scheduled with Google to determine requirements. Dave Rusko investigating.
