President's Message

Last year at this time the newly elected Board and I enthusiastically began sorting through our newly installed By Laws and management structure of the Club. Like most early endeavors, we had an aggressive agenda and high ambitions to improve our facility and expand our training and development programs to better meet the needs of our members and the shooting sports public. Our 501.c.3 Charter is dependent on our ability to deliver those services as economically possible and that requires the participation of Club Members like you. More on that later.

At our Annual Members' Meeting April 8th, we shared our accomplishments over the past 12 months and our plans for the year ahead. Again, these new projects are ambitious, but necessary to protect newly acquired equipment assets and repair end-of-life range infrastructure. Our new hires include a well-qualified Bookkeeper and Maintenance Technician. Both individuals bring a wealth of knowledge and experience that will provide us with opportunities to meet our management improvement goals across all aspects of our business. As a certified non-profit we understand that profitability is secondary to our Charter, but we also recognize that we cannot fulfill our Charter if we don't have a self-sustaining revenue stream. Every shooting discipline will be expected to carry its own weight financially and we will be tracking and validating our investments accordingly. As reported, we have been doing well financially for the last few years

and came out of the Covid period stronger than we anticipated. Good leadership and responsible management were critical to that success. Today, we are in a great position to accomplish the goals we have set for WCW and expect good progress in each of these areas throughout the next 12 months. Again, Members like you are critical when it comes to achieving those positive outcomes.

With the new fiscal year underway and Spring in full bloom, I ask that every WCW Club Member consider what you can do to help us reach the reasonable goals we have set for ourselves. We need Volunteers to assist with Training, Coaching and Supervising new and developing shooters. We need members who will help us maintain the grounds and ensure spring doesn't leave us knee deep in new and emerging growth around the Club. We will also need help with infrastructure projects once we have a clear picture of the defined scope and job requirements beyond our contracted services. All these activities are instrumental in making WCW a rewarding destination for our friends, families and shooting enthusiasts here in our community. A few hours, a whole day or whatever time you can spare, is and will always be greatly appreciated. The new folks you meet and come to know, influence and inspire will never forget your contribution to their skillset and competency.

It is now faster for us to switch the fields between Doubles, Continental, and 16-Yard as well as keeping the clay targets loaded so that we can keep the game going. APRIL 100/200 YARD RIMFIRE MATCH REPORT

The first Match of the 2026 WCW 100 / 200 Yard Rimfire Benchrest Season was held on April 25th. This is the fifth year of the WCW 100 / 200 Yard Rimfire Match, and it has now become a Match that people look forward to each year. We had 12 Competitors attend this month.

It was a sunny day with cold temperatures in the upper 30's when range setup began. However, the temperatures quickly rose so we were shooting in 49 – 54 degree temperatures. We had great wind conditions during the 100 yard target with an average wind speed of 1.0 mph and gusts in the 2 – 2.5 mph range. As the temperatures rose, the wind speeds were rapidly increasing when shooting the 200 yard target. The average wind speed increased to 3.0 mph with gusts in the 4 – 6.5 mph range which made shooting at 200 yards with a 22LR rimfire rifle very challenging. All weather information was taken from the Range 1 weather station.

100 Yards Results:

Kevin Kellogg started the Match off hot, shooting a perfect score of 200 at 100 yards. Kevin ties 3 other Competitors who have shot a perfect score of 200 at 100 yards during the Match. The 10 ring on the CBA target is only 0.69 inches in diameter, which means a very tight grouping is required for a 22LR at 100

yards. Behind Kevin, the scores were tight as the next 7 Competitors shot 100 yard scores between 198 and 195. Scott Price shot an outstanding score of 198 for 2nd place. Dale Hacker and Keith Wilson were only 1 point behind Scott shooting a 197 tying for 3rd place.

200 Yards Results:

As the wind conditions worsened on the 200 yard target, Eric Carter who was shooting prone, was able to master them and shot an outstanding 187 out of 200 for 1st place. Bill Ritchie and Nathan Hood both shoot a very good 181 tying for 2nd place.

Eric Carter rode his dominance of the windy conditions at 200 yards to the top total combined score for the April 2026, 100 & 200 yard Match with an outstanding score of 383 out of 400. Nathan Hood and Keith Wilson battled it out all day but in the end, they tied for 2nd place shooting a very good total combined score of 377. Keith out shoot Nathan by a single point at 100 yards, while Nathan out shot Keith by a single point at 200 tards.

“Buck – A – Shot” Winner:

The “Buck – A – Shot” winner for the April 2026 Match was Kevin Kellogg who shot an outstanding 9 point shot at 200 yards on the Cast Bullet 100 yard target in the windy conditions and won the \$12 pot.
